

CHRISTMAS AND 4TH ADVENT MESSAGE FROM FR. PETER MARR

When Mary and Joseph received their revelations from God that they were to be the bearer in Mary, and the father protector in Joseph, of the Messiah and Saviour of God's holy people, they must have wondered what great blessings were being be-



stowed on them. And they must have expected that good, and even great things were coming their way. We can only ponder how they must have wondered and perhaps questioned if they understood God's message correctly when they were forced to go to Bethlehem for the decreed census just as Mary was due to give birth. And upon arriving, only to find that there was no place for them to stay, not even the humblest of innkeeper's rooms was available. So they went, in desperation, to the stable, the lowly place where Jesus the promised messiah was born. It must have been a very difficult journey.

Imagining how Mary and Joseph must have felt by what they experienced can help us to look at our Christmas in a brighter light. This pandemic has cast surprising trouble and worry on virtually everything we are living in our time. There is no school, no workplace or home, no place in our society's life that is not affected by it in one way or another. So it would seem natural that we might have feelings of ennui, a listless dissatisfaction about the state of our lives and the world in general.

Yet this is where we are called too, to make the journey of faith that Mary and Joseph made. It seems like a contradiction of good sense. But God shows us in the birth of his Christ that he can make the impossible possible. Our loving God has sent his only Son to shatter our understanding and replace it with a reality in faith that leaves no one out in the cold, no one outside of his plan of salvation. Jesus has come to us in unexpected ways to gather us all around his love, the light that shines forth from the creche in the poor stable in Bethlehem. He reveals an unwavering truth, that God's greatest blessings come amid the trials of this life, and that faithfulness is the way to receive God's greatest gifts of faith, hope and love. Mary and Joseph understood and gave thanks for God's gifts in their journey, that there is no one who is not blessed by God's love in the birth of our Saviour. This unique Christmas, even in these difficult times, let us keep faith and give thanks for God's blessings as Mary and Joseph did.

Along with Fr. Neiman and our staff here at St. Boniface Parish, I would like to extend a very blessed and holy Christmas to everyone. Fr. Peter


