CYCLE C (LUKE)

Taking the Call: Scott Hahn Reflects on the Thirteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Readings: 1 Kings 19:16-21 Psalm 16:1-2, 5, 7-11 Galatians 5:1, 13-18 Luke 9:51-62

In this week's First Reading, Elijah's disciple is allowed to kiss his parents goodbye before setting out to follow the prophet's call. But we are called to follow a "greater than Elijah", this week's Liturgy wants us to know. In Baptism, we have put on the cloak of Christ, been called to the house of a



new Father, and been given a new family in the kingdom of God. We have been called to leave behind our past lives and never look back - to follow wherever He leads. Elijah was taken up in a whirlwind and his disciple was given a double portion of his spirit (see 2 Kings 2:9-15). Jesus too, the Gospel reminds us, was "taken up" (see Acts 1:2, 11, 22) and He gave us His Spirit to live by, to guide us in our journey in His kingdom. As this week's Epistle tells us, the call of Jesus shatters the yoke of every servitude, sets us free from the rituals of the old Law, and shows us the Law's fulfillment in the following of Jesus, in serving one another through love. His call sets our hands to a new plow, a new task - to be His messengers, sent ahead to prepare all peoples to meet Him and enter into His Kingdom. Elijah called down fire to consume those who wouldn't accept God (see 2 Kings 1:1-16). But we have a different Spirit with us. To live by His Spirit is to face opposition and rejection, as the Apostles do in this week's Gospel. It is to feel like an exile, with no lasting city (see Hebrews 13:14), no place in this world to lay our head or call home. But we hear the voice of the One we follow in this week's Psalm (see Acts 2:25-32; 13:35-37). He calls us to make His faith our own - to abide in confidence that He will not abandon us, that He will show us "the path to life," leading us to the fullness of joy in His presence forever.

Toronto's Largest Permanent Diaconate Ordination in Years a Testament to the Service of All Deacons

Last Saturday, June 18 at 10 a.m., 19 men were ordained permanent deacons in service to the Archdiocese of Toronto. Their ministry began in Toronto's St. Michael's Cathedral Basilica, but will extend far beyond the walls of any church.

The assignments for these new deacons reflect the diverse ways the Church is engaged in society: serving the poor in soup kitchens like St. Francis Table and Ripples of Kindness, and in food and clothing banks; accompanying the sick and dying in hospitals; and assisting those with intellectual disabilities. Other deacons visit prisons and support former prisoners through the Friends of Dismas ministry and provide pastoral care to itinerant workers through the Apostleship of the Seas.

Permanent deacons serve the Church by assisting the Archbishop and priests of the diocese. Their roles are to be focused on charitable work in the community, as well as ministering in parishes and schools, including serving directly at the altar - they have the liturgical authority to baptize children, witness marriages and preside at funerals.
