CYCLE C (LUKE)

#### **INSIGHT INTO LENT BY FR. ALEX OSEI, CSSp.**

Every thoughtful Christian instinctively recognizes that Lent is a special, grace-filled, and challenging time of the year. It is intelligible only in the light of its climax, Easter. The beginning is in ashes; the end is a paschal fire. The discipline of Lent is not an end, but a time of preparation of oneself to enter as fully as possible, in mind and heart, into the paschal mystery of the death and resurrection of Jesus Christ and of our own in union with him.

Lent leads us to personal conversion, life—long process of turning to Christ and allowing him to take over the direction of our lives. It is a life-long process of being filled with the ideals of the Gospel of Jesus. It is growing up in Christ, and it is not only for individual Christians, but for the entire church. On Tuesday of the first week of Lent we will pray: {"Father, look on us, your children. Through the discipline of Lent, help us to grow in our desire for you." what greater favor can we request than a deeper desire for God? St. Augustine remarked long ago about our restless, desire-filled hearts. He told us that they only one who could satisfy those hungry hearts was God himself. But the fulfillment comes only in proportion to the depth and genuineness of our desires. The more spiritually restless we are and the greater our hunger and desire for God, the greater will be our satisfaction at Easter.

Lent brings us to a deeper appreciation and love for the greatest treasure we have as Christians/Catholics. The Eucharist—the Mass. If confession is "lent in miniature, " the Mass is more. It makes the entire redeeming life, work, and sacrifice of Jesus present on our altars.

Lent is a collective retreat in daily life for the church, a time for entering more consciously in the mystery of Christ's Passover from death to resurrection. Lent is a time of prayer, so that we can unmask the subtle and destructive forces masquerading under the appearance of good in our own time, in our individuals lives, in the life of the church. Lent is a time not only for prayer, but also for fasting and almsgiving, which St. Augustine called "the wings of prayer", meaning that without the fasting and almsgiving, our prayer remains earthbound and ineffective.

Day by day Lent leads us along a road of ever-growing appreciation of the historical life, death, and resurrection of Jesus, now made present on our altars, so that we can take it to ourselves and add our own loving sacrificial life to it. Your presence, O Lord, I seek, Hide not your face from me.

### WHY IS THE NUMBER FORTY SIGNIFICANT?

Lent recalls the forty days of our Lord's fasting in the desert, which He undertook before entering into His public ministry. We read in the Gospel: "Jesus was led up by the Spirit into the wilderness to be tempted by the devil. He fasted for forty days and forty nights, and afterwards he was hungry" (Mt 4,1 -2). Like Moses, who fasted before



receiving the tablets of the Law (cf. Ex 34,28) and Elijah's fast before meeting the Lord on Mount Horeb (cf. 1 Kings19,8), Jesus, too, through prayer and fasting, prepared Himself for the mission that lay before Him.
